## Fees for Retired Clergy

Each Sunday service	£ 45 (max. £90 per Sunday)
Each weekday service	£ 30
Separate baptisms	£ 45
Marriages	£145
Funerals	£ 75
Burial of body or ashes on separate occasion	£ 38

These fees are payable to clergy "with permission to officiate" only. Beneficed clergy, self-supporting ministers and licensed lay ministers are **not** entitled to a fee. All of the above fees may be claimed from the Treasurer of the church concerned but for funerals etc. held in a venue other than in an Anglican Church, the claim shall be submitted to the Deanery Treasurer.

## Travel Expenses

Travel expenses at the rate of 53p per mile should be offered to all clergy and licensed lay ministers officiating at services (other than funerals in respect of which specific provision is made).

## Chapels of St. Tugual, Christ The Healer & St. Apolline

For the purpose of this Table of Fees St. Tugual's Chapel, the Chapel of Christ The Healer and St. Apolline's Chapel shall be treated as if the service had taken place in the parish church of St. Peter Port, St. Andrew or St. Saviour, respectively.
