CONSTITUTION & MANDATE

of the

DEANERY FACULTIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

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Constituted by Resolution of the Deanery Synod of the 20th May 2025.

CONSTITUTION

1. A chairperson, either a member of the House of Clergy (other than the Dean) or a member of the House of Laity, appointed by the Guernsey Deanery Synod.
2. A member of the House of Clergy and a lay person whose name is on the Deanery Electoral Roll, appointed by the Standing Committee.
3. One or more architects or surveyors, appointed by the Standing Committee.

The Committee may, at its discretion, seek advice from time to time in respect of any application for a faculty, from such persons or organisations who have a particular knowledge of the matter forming the substance of the application.

MANDATE

- A. Upon receipt of a request from the Dean (or, in the Dean's absence, a Vice Dean) to:
 1. consider, amongst other matters, whether the work described in an application for a Faculty might
 - (a) affect the character of the church as a building of special architectural or historic interest, or
 - (b) affect the archaeological importance of the church or churchyard; and
 2. comment on the proposal, and recommend whether or not the Faculty should be granted.
- B. To advise incumbents and churchwardens and, in the case of the ancient parishes, the Parochial Church Property Management Board, in the early stages of the formulation of proposals for significant work in parish churches.
